[21] The Lord visited Sarah just as he had said he would and did for Sarah what he had promised. When his son Isaac was eight days old, Abraham circumcised him just as God had commanded him to do. (Now Abraham was 100 years old when his son Isaac was born to him.)

INTRODUCTION TO THE LAST HYMN
