Footnote to the Celtic Blessing:

The Gaelic transcription was kindly provided by Dr. Emily McEwan, who is a linguistic anthropologist in Halifax, Nova Scotia, to whom we give our thanks. She says:

"The first verse in Gaelic and the last verse in English are equivalent; you could say one is a translation of the other. ("Gum beannaich an Tighearn' thu..." and "The Lord bless you and keep you").

The second Gaelic verse "Biodh a ghràs ort is gach beannachd" and the English verse immediately following, "May His favour be upon you" are equivalent.

The third English verse "May His presence go before you" doesn't have a Gaelic counterpart in the video.
