THE STORY SO FAR

Last time we saw Joseph he was in the king's prison, where he gets to know some of the king's servants. He thinks this might help him get out, but that plan doesn't work out immediately, until quite some time later, the King has two troubling dreams: about seven fat cows and seven gaunt cows, and seven healthy ears of corn and seven nasty, withered ears of corn. This wouldn't be too troubling in itself, but then the thin, unhealthy looking things gobbled up the heathy ones.

The king (that's Pharaoh) calls together all his advisers and tells them his dreams. They come up with nothing. Then the king's cupbearer remembers Joseph, who interpreted a dream for him, and tells the king of a man with spiritual insight and wisdom who was in prison with him. So Joseph is fetched, shaved, cleaned up and taken to Pharaoh. Joseph denies that he himself can interpret dreams but says that God can give insight.

And so from the king's dreams, Joseph tells him about the coming seven years of plenty and the seven years of scarcity. He sketches a 14-year plan for Pharaoh and suggests he will need someone to execute it. "Don't worry," says Pharaoh, "I've already thought of somebody: I'm appointing you." Joseph ends up as prime minister of Egypt, using his administrative skills to bring life to people instead of starvation.

Now meanwhile back in Canaan, things are looking grim for Jacob's family....

Genesis 42: 1-9; 45: 1-9 (New English Translation)

When Jacob heard there was grain in Egypt, he said to his sons, "Why are you looking at each other?" He then said, "Look, I hear that there is grain in Egypt. Go down there and buy grain for us so that we may live and not die."

So ten of Joseph's brothers went down to buy grain from Egypt. But Jacob did not send Joseph's brother Benjamin with his brothers, for he said, "What if some accident happens to him?" So Israel's sons came to buy grain among the other travellers, for the famine was severe in the land of Canaan.

Now Joseph was the ruler of the country, the one who sold grain to all the people of the country. Joseph's brothers came and bowed down before him with their faces to the ground. When Joseph saw his brothers, he recognized them, but he pretended to be a stranger to them and spoke to them harshly. He asked, "Where do you come from?" They answered, "From the land of Canaan, to buy grain for food."

Joseph recognized his brothers, but they did not recognize him. Then Joseph remembered the dreams he had dreamed about them, and he said to them, "You are spies; you have come to see if our land is vulnerable!"

[We pick up the story after Judah has offered to stay as a slave in Egypt in place of Benjamin to spare his father pain and grief.]

[45:1] Joseph was no longer able to control himself before all his attendants, so he cried out, "Make everyone go out from my presence!" No one remained with Joseph

when he made himself known to his brothers. He wept loudly; the Egyptians heard it and Pharaoh's household heard about it.

Joseph said to his brothers, "I am Joseph! Is my father still alive?" His brothers could not answer him because they were dumbfounded before him. Joseph said to his brothers, "Come closer to me," so they came near. Then he said, "I am Joseph your brother, whom you sold into Egypt. Now, do not be upset and do not be angry with yourselves because you sold me here, for God sent me ahead of you to preserve life! For these past two years there has been famine in the land and for five more years there will be neither ploughing nor harvesting. God sent me ahead of you to preserve you on the earth and to save your lives by a great deliverance. So now, it is not you who sent me here, but God. He has made me an adviser to Pharaoh, lord over all his household, and ruler over all the land of Egypt. Now go up to my father quickly and tell him, 'This is what your son Joseph says: "God has made me lord of all Egypt. Come down to me; do not delay!"'
